The following competition structure will enable more individual young people to represent your school in sport or physical activity at a level that is appropriate to their interests and competencies.

Each competition has been allocated to a tier, with a description of the tiers as follows. Please ensure that you are aware of the tier of competition so that you can select your teams appropriately.

Excel Competition	<p>Excel based competitions catering for the most talented athletes and teams that your school can field, subject to some eligibility criteria (e.g. National Governing Body age restrictions on competitions). These competitions are an opportunity to showcase the sporting prowess of your school and for teams to progress to County finals and in most competitions to Regional and National finals. We would advocate an 'in it to win it' approach to team selection for these competitions, however this does not mean that schools with 'weaker' sides should not enter as the local SSPAN and County Final structure will allow each school to perform at their relevant level as it has done so in the past.</p>
Development Competition	<p>In this category the focus is to increase the number of individual pupils that represent schools. These competitions provide the opportunity for less-engaged students, or those that are engaged but are perhaps less talented in traditional sports, to participate in non-traditional competitions. The ideal model for this is that the pupils that represent a school in the 'Excel Competitions' would not be eligible to play in 'Development Competitions', though we understand that there may be some crossover for smaller schools.</p> <p>This competition tier is a new addition but is mostly based on existing sports. Where previously many schools have entered football and rugby players into dodgeball competitions, we aim to limit this so that other pupils may have the opportunity to represent their school at sport, rather than the most talented few monopolising the competition offer. The number of competitions has therefore not increased, but the new focus caters for an increase in the number of individual pupils that participate.</p> <p>The structure and format of these events may differ slightly with the potential introduction of alternative scoring and adapted rules implemented to assist with the provision of a more appropriate level of competition for the participants involved.</p>
Inspire Event	<p>Competitions/events that have the potential for different pupils, outside of the above competition pathways to represent their school in an event that is first and foremost about taking part and developing skills through sport. (Both physical and sport-transferable skills as well as life skills).</p>

- Format:** This event will be delivered on a pooled or knockout basis with matches consisting of the following format:
- Schools will need to rank players in each team 1-4 based on ability, with 1 being the strongest.
 - Player 1 v Player 1, 2 v 2, 3 v 3, 4 v 4
 - Player 1 v Player 2, 2 v 1, 3 v 4, 4 v 3
 - 3 points for a win, 1 for a loss.
 - If teams are still tied on points then overall score difference will decide the match winner. If the match is still tied then a single first to 5 points game will be played by the no. 1 player from each team.

- Pathway:** The winning team will go on to represent NWLSSP at the County final, which is TBC

- Age Group:** Year 5/6
- Gender:** Boys
- Number of pupils:** 4 players per team (limit of 2 team per school).
- Target Group:** All pupils are eligible to play.
- Format:** This event will be delivered on a pool or knockout basis with matches consisting of the following format:
- Schools will need to rank players in each team 1-4 based on ability, with 1 being the strongest.
 - Player 1 v Player 1, 2 v 2, 3 v 3, 4 v 4
 - Player 1 v Player 2, 2 v 1, 3 v 4, 4 v 3
 - 3 points for a win, 1 for a loss.
 - If teams are tied on points, then overall score difference will decide the match winner. If the match is still tied, then a single first to 5 points game will be played by the no. 1 player from each team.
- Rules:** See below for full rules.
- Pathway:** The winning team will go on to represent NWLSSP at the County final, which is TBC



Table Tennis Rules

Starting the game/serving

- The person who wins the toss or rock paper scissors, will serve first in the first game; after 2 points, the receiver becomes the server and so on after each 2 points until the end of the game.
- If 10-10 is reached, the service is alternate.
- A good service starts with the ball resting on the palm of the hand with the ball thrown upwards about 6 inches (15cm); the server hits the ball from behind the end of the table so it bounces on their side of the table and then on the other side.
- A good return is made when the receiver hits the ball over the net on to the other side of the table.

How to play a point

- Each player strikes the ball after it has bounced once on their side of the table, to clear the net and land on the opponent's side.
- A point finishes when the ball is hit by the player and it does not bounce on the other side of the table – i.e. it misses the table or into the net
- A point is won/lost when:
 - A player misses the ball
 - The ball bounces twice
 - The ball does not land on the table
 - The ball does not clear the net

Lets

- A 'let' service is when the server serves the ball and it touches the net and hits the other side; the service is repeated until good.
- A 'let' will be called by the umpire if a ball comes into the playing area from an adjoining table.

Scoring:

- A game is won by the player first scoring 11 points, with a clear gap lead of 2 points; if both players score 10 points, then the game is won when one player has a lead of 2 clear points e.g. 13-11.



TAG RUGBY YEAR 5/6

- Dates and Venues:** Tuesday 1st October 2024 – Ashby Rugby Club (LE65 1DP)
Thursday 3rd October 2024 – Coalville Rugby Club (LE67 5PF)
- Time:** 12:00pm – 5:30pm
- Age Group:** Year 5/6
- Gender:** Teams must have a minimum of 4 boys and 4 girls in the squad, with at least 2 boys and 2 girls on the pitch at all times.
- Number of Pupils:** Teams of 8-a-side, max squad of 12 (limit of 2 teams per school).
- Target Group:** All pupils in the relevant age groups are eligible to compete.
- Format:**
- Schools will be put into pools and will play other schools in the pool in a round robin format.
 - Games will be two halves of a minimum of 6 minutes and a maximum of 10 minutes each way with 1 minute for half time. This may be changed dependent on number of entries.
 - In the pool stages, 3 points will be awarded for a win, 2 points for a draw and 1 point for a loss.
- Equipment:**
- Pupils will **need** to wear PE kit and **BOOTS**.
 - Each school will need to bring their own tag belts.
 - Appropriate clothing for outdoor activity is recommended.
 - Pupils will need to bring their own drinks.
- Rules:**
- See below.
- Pathway:**
- All participants will be given information on Coalville RFC and Ashby RFC on the day of the competition.
 - There is no level 3 progression for this event.



Tag Rugby Rules

Ball Carrying

- The ball must be carried in two hands and players must not obstruct the tags using the ball.

Free pass

- A free pass from the centre of the pitch is used to start the game, and after every time a try is scored. It is also used at the side of the pitch when the ball goes out of bounds from where the referee determines.
- Free passes cannot be taken nearer than 7m from the goal line. The pass must go backwards to a member of the team starting 2m away from the taker. Opponents must be 7m away.

Scoring

- To score a try the ball must be placed down behind the opponents scoring line (**no diving**).

Passing

- Passes must be made sideways or backwards. If the ball is passed forward or handed to a team mate the opposition is awarded a free pass.
- All passes should have air between the passer, the ball and the catcher. If there is no air between the pass it will be deemed a grab and a free pass awarded to the opposition.
- The ball cannot be slapped or grabbed out of an opposing players' hands. If the ball is slapped/grabbed out of a player hands a free pass will be awarded.

The Tag

- The tag is the removal of one of the tags from the ball carriers belt. The ball carrier can dodge but not prevent their tags being taken. Players must have 2 tags to be part of the game.
- When the ball carrier is tagged they must pass the ball within 3 seconds or 3 steps, the ball carrier has 1 step to score a try once tagged.
- After being tagged the player must retrieve and re-attach their tag before re-joining the game. The player making the tag must give the tag back to the player it came from and must not throw it on the floor.

Knock on

- A knock on occurs when a player attempting to catch the ball fumbles or drops it forwards, a free pass is awarded to the opposition.

Offside

- This is the hardest concept for the children to understand.
- An imaginary offside line is created horizontally across the pitch when a "tag" has been made.
- The defending team must get behind this line to continue playing and are only allowed over this line once the tagged player passes the ball.
- Defending players that cross this line and affects the play are offside.
- This stops defending players from standing in passing lanes and pulling tags before receiving the ball.

Penalties (Turn Over)

- Passing the ball forward/dropping the ball and it goes forward.
- Slapping, grabbing/snatching the ball off someone (your team or another team).
- Spinning to stop being tagged.
- Diving to score, pass or tag
- Contact in any form.

Free Pass

- Being offside and interfering with play (catching the ball, tagging a player, gets in the way of a pass).
- Contact in any form.

Age group: Years 5/6 **ONLY**

Number of pupils: A squad of up to 10 girls with 7 playing at any one time, 1 of whom shall be the goalkeeper (max of 1 team per school, if you would like to enter more than 1 team please email nwlssp@castlerock.org.uk to be added to a wait list).

Target group: All year 5/6 girls are eligible to play.

Equipment: Pupils must wear PE kit **including shin pads and football boots**. Long hair must be tied back and all jewellery removed.

Back Up Date: **If this event is unable to run due to waterlogged pitches or poor weather, the event will be moved to the 15th October 2024 also at Coalville Town F.C.**

Format:

- A round robin format or appropriately sized pools leading to a knockout in the later stages. This will be confirmed on the day based on the number of teams entered.
- Depending on the number of entries matches will be between 7-12 minutes.
- The pitches will be approximately 65m x 40m depending on the number of pitches required and the conditions of the pitches.
- The competition shall be governed in accordance with the Rules and Regulations of the Football Association for this age group.

This includes:

- Using size 4 footballs.
- Opponents must retreat to their own half from a goal kick.
- Points will be awarded in the round robin or pool stage as follows: 3 points for a win, 2 points for a draw and 1 point for a loss.
- In the event of two or more teams being equal on points the head to head results shall take precedence, the team that has conceded the fewest goals shall take precedence, then goal difference. If the teams are still tied, kicks from the penalty mark will take place.
- In the event of a draw in the knockout stage the match will go to 5 minutes of extra time one way, if it is still a draw at the end of this time the outcome will be decided by penalties.
- Substitutes shall be permitted at any time during the game, with the referee's permission and players may re-enter the game.

Progression:

Winners will progress to represent NWLSSP in the Pokémon Cup on Thursday 14th November 2024 (Small School Girls) & Saturday 9th November 2024 (Non-small School Girls).

Guidance:**

Recommended Footwear for Synthetic Surfaces

Footwear Types

3G Football Turf / Long pile Carpet			✘	✘	✘

- Blades: Use of footwear which has a bladed profile studded sole is prohibited.
- Metal (screw-in) Studs on Synthetic Turf for Rugby:** Metal Studs designed for Rugby are permitted provided they are Kite Marked and manufactured to BS 6366:2011 These types of studs are a mandatory requirement when playing rugby and are part of the IRB laws of the game. These types of studs are designed for player safety and the limit the potential damage to the playing surface.

It is important that the studs must be fitted correctly to the shoe sole and in a way that they cannot capture the turf fibers i.e. all studs are fully tightened and there is no gap between the studs and the sole of the boot. All studs must be free of sharp edges, have a smooth and undamaged surface and totally free of sharp burrs. The profile of the stud must be an even wear across the bottom of the stud.

Studs showing any of these defects are therefore PROHIBITED for use on the surface at any time whether in training or match situations It is the responsibility of the facility owner and/or club to check and monitor all footwear used on the surface prior to any person entering or using the synthetic turf field to verify compliance with these conditions.

It is also advisable that the facility owner and/or club ensure that all footwear is clean and free from mud, soil and stones, prior to usage on pitch. Failure to monitor this aspect will affect the sports performance and drainage of the turf system, plus bring onto the pitch foreign debris which could lead to player injury.

The use of flat soled training shoes and 'Astro' trainers should be prohibited as they flatten the pile of the carpet and increase the rate of compaction of the infill.

If significant use of such footwear is envisaged the surface manufacturer should be advised before a surface is selected and appropriate provision for additional maintenance and a reduced service life made.

- A ball that has been thrown and has not touched anything, including the floor, another ball, another player, official or other item outside of the playing field (wall, ceiling, etc).

Boundaries

- During play all players must remain within the boundary lines. Players may leave and enter the boundaries through their end line only to retrieve balls.

Opening Rush

- 3 balls are placed along the centre line. Players start behind the end line, touching the wall and on the official’s start they ‘rush’ in and collect any of the balls. They must then ensure that they pass the ball backwards to a member of their team before they are allowed to strike the opposition.

Equipment: NWLSSP will provide appropriate balls for the competition. All students must wear PE kit with all jewellery removed and long hair tied back.

Progression: The winning team will go on to represent NWLSSP in the Level 3 County finals. Date and times TBC.



PERSONAL BEST FEST

Age Group: KS2

Gender: Mixed

Number of Pupils Maximum of 10 pupils per school, any number of boys/girls.

Intent: To support individual development in sport.

Target Group: Low self-esteem issues, low sporting ability, in need of a positive sporting experience, haven't represented school at anything else and need encouragement to be active.

Aim: The aim of this event is to provide a positive, fun and engaging sporting experience for children who may have low self-esteem/low sporting ability and those who view sport in a negative light. The event is designed to teach children about determination, resilience and self-improvement to help their confidence and teach them to see challenges as opportunities to grow. It has been proven that having a growth mind set can improve a child's progress & attainment.

How will it work: Schools will identify up to 10 KS2 pupils who would benefit from this experience and complete the challenges in their school and record their personal best score on their personal best passport prior to the face to face event. This can be done once but ideally multiple times.

At the face to face event the pupils will complete the same challenges as before and attempt to beat their personal best. This event is all about being the best they can be and trying to beat their own scores, not competing against other pupils.

Format Upon arrival pupils will be put into mixed teams with pupils from other schools to rotate around the personal best challenge stations which will be randomly selected from the Best Fest passport. These stations are the same activity for Year 3/4 and Year 5/6 pupils but can be adapted to be better suited to the age of the pupil taking part.

Equipment: All students must wear PE kit with all jewellery removed and long hair tied back, pupils should also bring their own water bottle and their personal best passport.
